Important Information – Iowa Catholic Conference: Your help is needed during the July 4th recess to tell your congresspersons what to include in -- and keep out of -- health care reform. The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) is asking for calls to members of Congress on July 7 and 8 with our Catholic principles for health care reform, which include:

Include health care coverage for all people from conception until natural death, and continue the federal ban on funding for abortions;

Include access for all with a special concern for the poor;

Pursue the common good and preserve pluralism, including freedom of conscience; and

Restrain costs and apply costs equitably among payers.

In our Catholic tradition, health care is a basic human right. Access to health care should not depend on where a person works, how much a family earns, or where a person lives. Instead, every person, created in the image and likeness of God, has a right to life and to those things necessary to sustain life, including affordable, quality health care. This teaching is rooted in the biblical call to heal the sick and to serve "the least of these," our concern for human life and dignity, and the principle of the common good.

REFLECTION QUESTIONS: (Ezekiel 2:2-5, 2 Corinthians 12:7-10, Mark 6:1-6) When and why have others ever said to you "You're just too much" or "Who do you think you are?" when they disapproved of you? What might these complaints reveal about the ones who make them? What questions did the people of Nazareth have about Jesus? Why do you think they were so determined to reject him?
